LANE DRIVE HOSTAGE RESCUE DEBRIEF

In October 2018, Cobb County Police SWAT officers were requested by Uniform Patrol to respond to 391 Lane Drive, Mableton, GA, regarding an active hostage taker incident. The hostage taker had shot and killed an elderly female prior to police arriving on scene. SWAT officers arrived on scene and relieved uniform personnel, who had established an emergency reaction team inside the residence. SWAT counter-sniper positions were also established. The Crisis Negotiations Team (CNT) also responded to the scene and were successful in making contact with the suspect and learned that the suspect was armed with a handgun and had two hostages inside the master bedroom - a 24 year old female and her 7 year old daughter. The female hostage was the ex-girlfriend of the suspect. During negotiations, the suspect stated several times he would release the child out of an upstairs window that dropped down to a corrugated metal roof just below. The suspect eventually opened the window, but again, changed his mind and pulled the child away. Seconds later, a loud noise consistent with a gunshot was heard by the emergency response team. Due to exigent circumstances that the suspect was shooting the hostages, entry was made through the bedroom door that was barricaded and the suspect was shot. Both hostages were rescued and were unharmed.

BUILDING THE SHOOTER OF THE 21ST CENTURY

LAW ENFORCEMENT PROTECTIVE SECURITY OPERATIONS

The Law Enforcement Protective Security Operations (LE-PSO) seminar is designed to provide the students with basic principles and concepts related to protective operation missions. Law enforcement officers are often tasked with this unique mission with little or no formal training. This 4-hour seminar will serve as an introduction and will highlight the 5-day comprehensive Law Enforcement Protective Security Operations Training Program (LE-PSOTP) based largely on the established and tested methodologies used by the U.S. Secret Service and the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Diplomatic Security Service. Subjects covered include Introduction to Protective Operations for LE; Protective Security Formations; Motorcade Operations (Arrival/Departure); Attack on Principal Drills; Threat Identification and Mitigation; Protective Security Equipment; and Protective Agent COF.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Jacket – BDU type shirt or blouse is sufficient; handgun; (100 rounds of FRANGIBLE AMMO); belt type holster (either inside the waistband (IWB) or outside the waistband holster (OWB) – CONCEALED); eye and ear protection; and water to stay hydrated. SPECIAL OPERATIONS COMBATIVES PROGRAM (SOCP)

John Kirkland, Orange County SO / Greg Thompson, Team R.O.C.

SOCP (Special Operations Combatives Program) is a realism based, task-specific system designed to bridge the gap between foundational fight skills and the unique needs of the modern day assaulter in the CQB environment. SOCP is the designated combatives program for all U.S. Army Special Operations Forces. ERB Codes: (SOCP I: BRT), (SOCP II: FBR) SOCP is now the standard program for fighting in kit and bridging the gap between CQB and combatives. SOCP is currently being implemented at Special Forces Units 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 10th, SWCS, Special Forces advanced skills battalion, 75 Ranger Regiment, Marine RECON, MARSOC, Air Force SERE, Para Rescue and is spreading fast to other Special Units, FBI, ATF, Border Patrol and other Federal and State Law Enforcement, including Orange County Sheriff's Office SWAT, as well as Special Contract Units. SOCP Concepts: *Fighting in Kit with weaponry; *Weapon transition & retention standing or on ground; *360 degree ambush attacks into and over objects; *Fighting multiple assailants solo or as a team; *Compliant and non-compliant cuffing and vehicle extractions; *Force continuum (lethal/less-than-lethal options); and *Technique 'linkage'.

STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: BDU style pants; shirt of choice (dry fit recommended); helmet (NODS attachments stripped); flat sole or wrestling shoes; holster or shooter belt is ok; NO WEAPONS (training weapons will be provided); water bottle and snacks.
