#### **2016 MARCUS SCHUMACHER DOMESTIC INCIDENT DEBRIEF**

##### **Lieutenant William Ahlfeldt and Sergeant Matt Christensen, Fargo Police Department**

In February 2016, Fargo Police Department officers responded to a domestic disturbance incident during which shots had been fired. As patrol responded and began to set up a perimeter, suspect Marcus Schumacher fired rounds from inside his residence, killing Officer Jason Moszer while he was getting into his perimeter position. This debrief will discuss the patrol response, the murder of Officer Jason Moszer and the ensuing SWAT Team response and resolution. The presentation will include audio from phone calls with Schumacher, squad car video, radio traffic, and discussion of the tactics used to bring the incident to a conclusion.

#### **NIGHT VISION GOGGLE FAMILIARIZATION – Sergeant David Meyers, Counterdrug, Florida National Guard**

This classroom-based course provides students with knowledge in the safe operation, handling, and employment of their agency-issued Night Vision Goggles (NVGs) to increase their safety and that of the public during the execution of their narcotic and other enforcement duties. Focus will be on theory and principals of NVGs, application of visible and infrared energy systems, photonic barrier defeat methods, passive and active aiming, how all of these tools are combined to ensure mission success and much more. NVGs and associated systems are not required to take this course, but should be brought to the course if you have them.

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: BDU style pants and polo or t-shirt. You can bring your agency issued NVG's to the course, but it is not required.**

### **LAW ENFORCEMENT PROTECTIVE SECURITY OPERATIONS**

**Tom Wynn, (DHS HSI (Retired), Wynn Solutions Group, Inc. / Willie Womack, (DHS HSI (Retired)**

The Law Enforcement Protective Security Operations (LE-PSO) seminar will provide the students with basic principles and concepts related to protective operation missions. Law enforcement officers are often tasked with this unique mission with little or no formal training. This 4-hour seminar will serve as an introduction and will highlight the 5-day comprehensive Law Enforcement Protective Security Operations Training Program (LE-PSOTP) based largely on the established and tested methodologies used by the U.S. Secret Service and the U.S. Department of State's Bureau of Diplomatic Security Service. Subjects covered include Introduction to Protective Operations for LE; Protective Security Formations; Motorcade Operations (Arrival/Departure); Attack on Principal Drills; Threat Identification and Mitigation; Protective Security Equipment; and Protective Agent COF.

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Jacket – BDU type shirt or blouse is sufficient; handgun; (100 rounds of FRANGIBLE AMMO); belt type holster (either inside the waistband (IWB) or outside the waistband holster (OWB) – CONCEALED); eye and ear protection; and water to stay hydrated. Weapons and protective security equipment MUST BE CONCEALED during this training course. NO THIGH HOLSTERS!**

### **OFFICER RESCUE - William J. (BJ) Hall / John Mikula / Peter Roehrig, Florida SWAT Association**

This course will focus on the rescue of a downed officer/civilian and treatment. Students will be trained in advanced rescue techniques that can be used to perform a rescue in a high-risk environment and the treatment to increase the chance of survival of the downed officer/civilian. Students will be trained in an open field rescue, rescue from a vehicle, and rescue from a structure. During the training, we will teach the students how to extract an injured person from the point of injury using drag and carries, as well as other extraction devices (skeds, litters, etc.).

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Tactical uniform, vest, helmet, gloves and eye protection. NO WEAPONS OR AMMO!**

### **POSITIVE INSTANT RESPONSE (PIR) FOR SURVIVAL SHOOTING PERFORMANCE**

**Mark Wheeler (North FL Agency Liaison / Kevin Howard (Central FL Agency Liaison), Florida Bullet**

This course will address issues and strategies developed in skill-based learning techniques, specifically Positive Instant Response, total body focus, and responses to neuroscience that have identified why people do what they do, positive and negative reinforcement. This course will outline how to PIR, with drill **sequence, timing, repetition, and evaluation at each step** to build the foundation in which all shooter survival principles improve by developing subconscious shooter techniques. Performance should then be at a high level in the field regardless of any sensory overloaded survival situation. Diagnosis of shooting issues will also be covered, time permitting.

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Students are expected to bring** duty/SWAT handgun and rig; shooters will need 3 magazines; ball cap; eye and ear protection; and gloves if you operate with them in the field.

### **QUICK REACTION FORCE (QRF) TRAINING**

QRF training will involve a live fire course working through crowds and engaging suspect(s). The QRF will be in two four-man elements while providing an over watch detail. Lots of moving targets and challenges involved in a mass shooting scenario. This course will also encompass all aspects of deployment utilizing an Armored Vehicle, to include loading and unloading tactics, hands-on officer rescues, immediate action drills, and live fire and firearms training within the vehicle and outside the vehicle.

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Students are expected to bring all weapons systems issued to them by their agency with sufficient ammunition to conduct firearms training (full kit – handguns (100 rounds) – long guns (200 rounds); eye protection; ear protection; helmet; entry/heavy vest; and water to stay hydrated.**

### **SPECIAL OPERATIONS COMBATIVES PROGRAM (SOCP)**

**John Kirkland, Orange County SO / Greg Thompson, Team R.O.C.**

SOCP (Special Operations Combatives Program) is a realism based, task-specific system designed to bridge the gap between foundational fight skills and the unique needs of the modern day assaulter in the CQB environment. SOCP is the designated combatives program for all U.S. Army Special Operations Forces. ERB Codes: (SOCP I: BRT), (SOCP II: FBR) SOCP is now the standard program for fighting in kit and bridging the gap between CQB and combatives. SOCP is currently being implemented at Special Forces Units 1st, 3rd, 5th, 7th, 10th, SWCS, Special Forces advanced skills battalion, 75 Ranger Regiment, Marine RECON, MARSOC, Air Force SERE, Para Rescue and is spreading fast to other Special Units, FBI, ATF, Border Patrol and other Federal and State Law Enforcement, including Orange County Sheriff's Office SWAT, as well as Special Contract Units. SOCP Concepts: \*Fighting in Kit with weaponry; \*Weapon transition & retention standing or on ground; \*360 degree ambush attacks into and over objects; \*Fighting multiple assailants solo or as a team; \*Compliant and non-compliant cuffing and vehicle extractions; \*Force continuum (lethal/less-than-lethal options); and \*Technique 'linkage'.

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: BDU style pants; shirt of choice (dry fit recommended); helmet (NODS attachments stripped); flat sole or wrestling shoes; holster or shooter belt is ok; NO WEAPONS (training weapons will be provided); water bottle and snacks.**

### **SWAT RIFLE COURSE – Dave Hinkell, Sig Sauer Academy**

The SWAT Rifle course increases the operators handling skills with the patrol rifle. Drills are designed to improve the operator's proficiency and handling capabilities using reduced time limits and hit zones. The shooters will be tested throughout the course using performance based training drills (i.e., static shooting drills, positional shooting; shooting on the move, reloads and malfunction drills, transition to pistol and wounded officer reload techniques).

**STUDENT REQUIREMENTS: Estimated round count: (300) rifle rounds and (50) handgun rounds; patrol rifle with sling and (3) magazines; duty handgun with (3) magazines minimum; belt mounted holster or duty rig; magazine pouches; sunscreen and bug spray; hydration system; wraparound eyewear (polycarbonate lenses or non-shattering prescription glasses); earmuffs and earplugs; knee pads; and TAC vest.**
